Thank you for your continued support as we all work together to keep our community as safe as possible from COVID-19. We tested 27 people last week and had no new positive results!

As of this writing, Floyd County's positivity rate has gone down to 5.4%. Easter gatherings, larger events and Spring Break events could still escalate this percentage. There are many states currently having a fourth spike. Please stay vigilant.

The fact that we have such a high number of vaccinations means we do NOT have to change any visitation policies. However, this could change at any time.

*IF* you are post 14 days of your second vaccine shot, your family and friends can visit in your home now. Please leave your masks on and socially distance as much as possible. You can actually hug each other after initial screening, hand sanitizing, and wearing masks. Not exactly like we used to get to hug but it is indeed much better than not touching each other at all. Please read that again...**IF** you are post 14 days of your second vaccine shot, this paragraph pertains to you.

*At this time, we are still not eating with guests in common areas.* We must do everything to ensure that we are not bringing potential positive cases and eating together when masks are off. If your guests or family have been vaccinated, you can order food to go and eat together in your homes. Please be patient and know that one day we will be able to eat with families in common areas but NOT yet!

No updates have been received from the health department regarding dining and the guidelines for opening dining rooms *completely*.

Remember that anyone post-14 days of *both* rounds of the vaccine DOES NOT have to test any longer! Unless you have any symptoms or are in a situation that makes you uncomfortable because of size of event or close proximity to people you do not know, testing is no longer necessary!

The Governor has renewed the Public Health State of Emergency until April 30, 2021. Looking forward to hearing what he says for our state.
